The following items are discussed and the corresponding resolutions are adopted: Item-1 Confirmation of the minutes of the earlier meeting held on 05.03.2016



> He proposed to recruit a dedicated team to get funding. This team has the

responsibility of getting the projects.

> He expressed that due to present market scenario, many B. Tech and M. Tech graduates will turn towards teaching. So, the aforementioned course might be useful for the students' future.

> He suggested the importance of Publicity which plays a crucial role in present global market. He insisted that the points like highest attendance, Highest Marks, Least Failures, Highest Placements and Highest Percentage of Pass to be highlighted about Vignan.

> He suggested to conduct Faculty up-gradation programme and he insisted that teaching has to be more creative and attractive to the students.

## 7.2 Recommendation of Padma Bhushan Dr. Y. L. Prasad

- > He has acknowledged all the points addressed by Governing Body Vice-Chairman Dr.L.Rathaiah.
- > He advised to increase the Professor ratio in all branches of B.Tech, so that the students will get more and more knowledge in all parameters.
- > He suggested to motivate the students of Intermediate and other colleges by conducting Quizzes and other activities related to the survey of best college in Visakhapatnam through Rotary Club or Lions Club.
- > He advised to increase the admission in Mechanical Engineering by creating awareness on Mechanical Engineering importance in women students.
- > He advised not to over pamper the faculty from IITs and NITs which will spoil the work atmosphere and make other staff members feel apprehensive.

- > He suggested to conduct guest lecturers by inviting adjunct professors from industry at-least 6 days in a semester.
- > He suggested to maintain at-least 2 seminar halls in college campus as per AICTE norms.
- > He suggested to recruit at-least one doctorate in each branch from NIT/IIT for good teaching and research output.
- > He advised to elaborate the library and canteen infrastructure.
- > He suggested to give cash prizes or incentives to students who are having more than 90 percent attendance in each semester.
- > He advised to establish a separate attendance cell in the college for monitoring attendance of students as well as communicate to the parents.
- > He advised to ask alumni students' sponsorship to the students who are not undergone the CRT classes due to financial problems.
- > He suggested to improve the faculty participation in FDPs and workshops.

### 7.4 Recommendation of Sri. Venkata Rayulu Bonam:

- > He suggested to recruit faculty with industry experience. So that the students will acquire practical exposure about recent trends.
- > He advised the faculty to improve their knowledge in industry related areas

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  - > He suggested the faculty to train up the students to meet the industry requirements in the present scenario

## 7.5 Recommendation of Dr. V. Vizia Saradhi:

- > He suggested to implement biometric attendance seriously in the campus and it should be facilitate the SMS service to the parents.
- > He advised to maintain health records of all the students. The health condition should be recorded at the time of joining and at the time of leaving the college.
