A One weekAwareness Program was Organized by the IQAC at Vignan's Institute of Engineering For Women, Visakhapatnam on 24.06.2019-29.06.2019.

The title of the Programme is "Challenges in NIRF for Affiliated Institution". The aim and scope of this program is to provide for ranking of institutions in five broad generic groups of parameters, namely: i) Teaching, Learning and Resources; ii) Research and Professional Practice; iii) Graduation Outcome; iv) Outreach and Inclusivity; and v) Perception. to train and provide Knowledge on NIRF. By and large, India Rankings continues to give a lot of emphasis to collection, verification and use of reliable data, unlike global rankings that gives dis-proportionate weightage to perception and internationalization (in terms of international students and international faculty), NIRF relies on ranking based on data, which is more objective, especially in a large higher education system like India, where perception data alone can be misleading and amenable to manipulation. Although, the task of collection, verification, and authentication of data from a large number of institutions, is challenging.

Resource Person Overview:

Dr. Y. Jyothhi, Associate Dean, IQAC and Assistant Professor in Mechanical Engg. The focus of governments for the past few years has been to achieve three important goals – "access, equality and excellence". Although substantial progress has been made over the years a lot more needs to be done to achieve all the three goals, particularly on the excellence front. The Ministry of HRD and regulatory bodies have initiated a series of reforms and have also introduced several schemes to bring 'quality' to the top agenda of Indian Higher Education.

About the Program:

Indian Higher Education is in need of radical reforms. A focus on enforcing higher standards of transparency, strengthening of the vocational and doctoral educational pipeline and professionalization of the sector through stronger institutional responsibility would help in reprioritizing efforts towards excellence. To achieve this aim MHRD has taken an initiative to establish a ranking agency for quality assessment.

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) was launched on 29th September 2015 by MHRD to rank Higher Educational Institutions in the Country based on objective, verifiable criteria to promote competitive excellence in the higher educational institutions. For the use of the participating institutions (institutes accredited/affiliated to the AICTE/UGC) a web based platform has been set up, in which the institutions are invited to register themselves.

Ranking promotes competition among the Universities and drives them to strive for excellence. The rankings assume significance as performance of institutions has been linked with "Institutions of Eminence" scheme. Only Higher Educational Institutions currently placed in the top 500 of Global Rankings or top 50 of the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) are eligible to apply for the eminence tag. Institutions with the eminence tag would be allowed greater autonomy without having to report to the University Grants Commission (UGC). They would be able to admit foreign students and recruit faculty from abroad, and follow a flexible course and fee structure to enable them to vault to the ranks of the top Global Institution. The private Institutions of Eminence can also come up as 'greenfield ventures' - provided the sponsoring organization submits a convincing perspective plan for 15 years.

TECHNICAL SESSION - I:

NIRF Quality parameters Technical Session – I began after the inaugural session. The session is focused on the preparatory work related to NIRF and the design of internal organization system in HEIs and NIRF quality parameters. Prof. B. Rajasekhar, Pro-Chancellor, University of Hyderabad was the key resource person. He explained the importance and methodology of NIRF. He pointed out the gaps in preparatory works and the difficulties being faced by the colleges and universities in collecting and collating the data and information. He also pointed out that there are no separate wing in colleges/Universities for preparing documents and data for rankings. Even most of the colleges are very reluctant to upload their college details in website. Most of the data available in websites are not consistent and not properly updated. He insisted that prime responsibility of colleges is to update their websites. In future ranking agencies are going to directly extract the data rather than asking to submit application. He also explained how to achieve more marks from the 'perceptions' sub component. He told that unfortunately most of the south institutions are not known to public and stakeholders, hence they are getting less marks in perception category. The institutions in Tamilnadu are getting good marks in this category by promoting the brand image of their institutions.

All the faculty members who are publishing research papers should be asked to submit their papers in open access agencies like Research Gate, Google scholar etc. Such measure will ensure the institution identity on the research front. Also by conducting international conferences, seminars, by inviting eminent persons across the country and also from abroad, institutions name will be known to stakeholders across the country and it helps in scoring high under the head 'perceptions'.

TECHNICAL SESSION - II:

Ranking Process and Data Uploading: Technical Session-II started after lunch break. Prof. K. SubbaRao, NITTTR, Kolkata was the key resource person. He explained all the parameters and functions used in NIRF ranking. He also elaborated how to calculate the functions according to the respective colleges' data. He interacted with all the participants and clarified the doubts.

Many participants shared their experiences and problems faced in uploading the data for NIRF. They also shared opinions on the workshop. Some of the doubts expressed by the participants in filling various forms were clarified. A user friendly App was developed by APSCHE to give online support for ranking process. Queries posted on App will be answered by renowned resource persons immediately, so that the doubts can easily be clarified.

A Two Days Seminar on National Educational Policy NEP 2020

A Two days Seminar Program was Organized by the IQACat Vignan's Institute of Engineering For Women, Visakhapatnam on 17.08.2020-18.08.2020.

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 was released on July 30, 2020. The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) had constituted a Committee for drafting the National Education Policy in June 2017. The Committee submitted a draft NEP for public consultation in May 2019. The NEP will replace the National Policy on Education, 1986. The NEP recommends that the existing structure of school education must be restructured to make it more relevant to the needs of students at different stages of their development. The current 10+2 structure of school education will be redesigned into a 5-3-3-4 design comprising: (i) five years of foundational stage (for ages 3 to 8), (ii) three years of preparatory stage (for ages 8 to 11 or classes three to five), (iii) three years of middle stage (for ages 11 to 14 or classes six to eight), and (iv) four years of secondary stage (for ages 14 to 18 or classes 9 to 12).

About the Program:

Online teaching platform and tools: Appropriate existing e-learning platforms such as SWAYAM, DIKSHA, will be extended to provide teachers with a structured, user-friendly, rich set of assistive tools for monitoring progress of learners. Tools, such as, two-way video and two way-audio interfaces for holding online classes are a real necessity as the present pandemic has shown.

Virtual Labs: Existing e-learning platforms such as DIKSHA, SWAYAM and SWAYAMPRABHA will also be leveraged for creating virtual labs so that all students have equal access to quality practical and hands-on experiment-based learning experiences. The possibility of providing adequate access to SEDG students and teachers through suitable digital devices, such as tablets with pre-loaded content, will be considered and developed.

Training and incentives for teachers: Teachers will undergo rigorous training in learner-centric pedagogy and on how to become high-quality online content creators themselves using online teaching platforms and tools. There will be emphasis on the teacher's role in facilitating active student engagement with the content and with each other.

Online assessment and examinations: Appropriate bodies, such as the proposed National Assessment Centre or PARAKH, School Boards, NTA, and other identified bodies will design and implement assessment frameworks encompassing design of competencies, portfolio, rubrics, standardized assessments, and assessment analytics. Studies will be undertaken to pilot new ways of assessment using education technologies focusing on 21st century skills.

A New Education Policy aims to facilitate an inclusive, participatory and holistic approach, which takes into consideration field experiences, empirical research, stakeholder feedback, as well as lessons learned from best practices. It is a progressive shift towards a more scientific approach to education. The prescribed structure will help to cater the ability of the child – stages of cognitive development as well as social and physical awareness. If implemented in its true vision, the new structure can bring India at par with the leading countries of the world. National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is a big revolution replacing the 34-year-old policy idea and envisioning bringing about the much-needed modification in the Indian Education System. The Policy has maintained a delicate balance between the traditions and the interdisciplinary approach, which is the need of the 21st century. NEP has the potential to revamp the skills of the youth of our country and has all the right tools that are needed to be competitive at the global level. Needless to say, the New Education Policy is undoubtedly a progressive and ambitious policy that India is waiting for.

Education is fundamental for achieving full human potential, developing an equitable and just society, and promoting national development. Providing universal access to quality education is the key to India's continued ascent, and leadership on the global stage in terms of economic growth, social justice and equality, scientific advancement, national integration, and cultural preservation. Universal high-quality education is the best way forward for developing and maximizing our country's rich talents and resources for the good of the individual, the society, the country, and the world. India will have the highest population of young people in the world over the next decade, and our ability to provide high-quality educational opportunities to them will determine the future of our country.

The global education development agenda reflected in the Goal 4 (SDG4) of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted by India in 2015 - seeks to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all" by 2030. Such a lofty goal will require the entire education system to be reconfigured to support and

This National Education Policy 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century and aims to address the many growing developmental imperatives of our country. This Policy proposes the revision and revamping of all aspects of the education structure, including its regulation and governance, to create a new system that is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century education, including SDG4, while building upon India's traditions and value systems. The National Education Policy lays particular emphasis on the development of the creative potential of each individual. It is based on the principle that education must develop not only cognitive capacities – both the " foundational capacities of literacy and numeracy and "higher-order" cognitive capacities, such as critical thinking and problem solving – but also social, ethical, and emotional capacities and dispositions.

This must be incorporated taking into account the local and global needs of the country, and with a respect for and deference to its rich diversity and culture. Instilling knowledge of India and its varied social, cultural, and technological needs, its inimitable artistic, language, and knowledge traditions, and its strong ethics in India's young people is considered critical for purposes of national pride, self-confidence, self-knowledge, cooperation, and integration.
